



Traverse Route: After you leave the top of the rope tow heading South on Oreo, there will be dead “old burn” trees on your right. When the burn meets the first live trees, that marks the start of the traverse route. Staying on the mellow ridgeline you will be heading Southwest, you will cross one road, but sometimes hard to see in the winter. You pass just to the left of a small rock point which you can see on google earth maps. As you cross the next road, you should be able to see the yurts. No skins are needed for this option (unless you detour far off the route).

Forest Service Road 5734 Option: You use this route as the exit from the Ridgeline Yurts, no skins needed. You can use skins on an entrance or even just walk on the road if the trail is packed down. When you leave the top of the rope tow heading South on Oreo, you will go down one steeper hill before a long flat section of Oreo. At the bottom of the steeper section, you need to start looking for the Forest Service road! Don't try to keep speed as you don't need speed, you need to be paying attention as the road is not obvious. The road leaves Oreo directly across from the Bottle Neck gate dropping down into Lost Trail, marked in pink on the map and the gate has a pin. The yurts are .25 miles from Oreo.
